Hope in Jesus' Day

In Jesus day the people of Israel were all hoping for the Messiah (Saviour) to come. We have a huge advantage over the world in that, when we are hoping for something,

we can go to Jesus and pray about it and He will hear us. Those who don't know Jesus as their Saviour don't see that as an option. VERY SAD.

What can you do to build your hope?

- Bring concerns to God in prayer and lay them at His feet.
- Ask God if there is something, He wants you to do as part of the solution
- Rehearse God's answers to prayer that have happened before, both yours and ones, others have had

1 Corinthians 10:11-13 New International Version (NIV)

These things happened to them as examples and were written down as warnings for us, on whom the culmination of the ages has come. So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall! No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to mankind. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can endure it.

What can you do to protect your hope?

- HOPE AND RELY ON GOD
- Begin reading about people's difficulties in the bible and how God answered them
- Allow the believing family of God to be a strength to you

Things that can damage your hope

- Focusing on people's doubting
- Focusing on how difficult it is to accomplish
- Focusing on how bad the problem is
- Stop trusting God to do it for you

What a lack of hope does

- Hopelessness is mentally damaging
- It is spiritually damaging
- It can be physically damaging

“Hopelessness has become the common reason behind suicide. People who are disturbed and have commonly been seen with the presence of suicidal ideation or continuous experiences of self-harming have hopelessness in the background. This is very essential to understand the mechanism of stress and its connection with hopelessness because of ineffective coping or lack of strong understanding in coping skills. Common presence of hopelessness is harmful and provides difficult situations in individuals and families where results are ending lives or self-harming. At the end families have to join hands with health care providers to work on how to improve positive behavior and ignite hope among these people. Such kind of strategic endeavors can save lives, build a hopeful society and bring a positive mental health change.”

“A survey was conducted in Pakistan between years of 2015-2016, showed that more than 300 people per year experience hopelessness due to unemployment, family conflicts, extreme poverty and health problems [7]. This situation creates a lot of burden in individuals’ lives and coping with stress becomes impossible for them. Ultimately their results are depression or hopelessness leading to self-harm or suicide in the majority of the cases [8].”

The lack of self worth is a big part of how hopelessness takes root in someone’s life. Circumstances encroach on the self worth of a person, and before long the perception of their future becomes negative to the point that suicide is considered to be an option.

Jesus came to bring hope. Hope for what?

- He came to bring hope from the despair people can have that personal value means little.
- He came to bring hope that the impossible could change.
- He came that evil could be overcome
- He came that people could see a future even after death

Israel, at Jesus time, was enduring a tyrannical Roman Empire where Jewish lives were cheap. They wanted a Messiah for reasons not in view when Isaiah’s prophecy was announced. They wanted a Saviour for purely

humanitarian earthly reasons. They forgot where the real need was and how eternal reasons mean more.

Jesus wanted people to see Him as more than a quick fix for the Roman occupation. He wanted them to see Him as an eternal Messiah who was after their hearts. This is why He sent John the Baptist beforehand to announce what He was going to do.

John 1:29-31 New International Version (NIV)

²⁹ The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, “Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! ³⁰ This is the one I meant when I said, ‘A man who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.’ ³¹ I myself did not know him, but the reason I came baptizing with water was that he might be revealed to Israel.”

What made this kind of hope valuable was that it was the Lord Jesus bringing it and would provide it to anyone who asks. God Almighty was bringing aid to all mankind for all things. All you have to do is ask and put your trust in Him.

Jesus was the voice that said man is valuable to Him and because He made mankind, He wants them to be restored to the value He initially had given them. Do we understand that God cares about us realizing all the value He places on us?

Jesus was the one who could make miracles and changing the impossible automatic. His power made it seem very normal to have miracles happen. What things do you need changed? What issue do you want God to intervene on?

2 Corinthians 9:8

Jesus came and demonstrated right in front of everyone how much more powerful He was than the devil by casting out demons, healing diseases, and bringing people back to life from death.
